# US ARMY MARS Military Auxiliary Radio System

- Provide contingency radio communications to the Department of Defense and ALL Supported Agencies
- Assist in effecting normal communications under emergency conditions
- Provide training in military communications, techniques, and procedures
- Conduct Amateur radio exercises as part of annual Armed Forces Day





### Who Does Army MARS Report To?

- > Army MARS fits into a chain of command. 10 Region Directors report to the CAM.
- > Chief of Army MARS reports to the Network Enterprise Technology Command (NETCOM), which operates the U.S. Army's worldwide computer and communications networks.
- > NETCOM in turn has vertical links to the Army Cyber Command, Which is charged with network protection and the Army's Chief Information Officer/G5, who reports to the Secretary of the Army.




- VOICE: single sideband


## MARS and Amateur Radio Operators













Amateur Radio operators represent the nation's reservoir of electronic experts. MARS is a military auxiliary that utilizes this resource for Defense. It is through the service of these citizen volunteers that AMARS can accomplish its mission.

### **MARS & Amateur Radio Operators**

AMARS looks to Amateur Radio to provide human resources that are knowledgeable and skilled in the following areas:

- Communicating effectively and concisely utilizing specific protocols and procedures; improvising and adapting existing guidance to new or unanticipated conditions.
- Operating and maintaining telecommunications technology, including HF radio equipment and antennas.
- Utilizing computer equipment in conjunction with radio transceivers; installing and updating of software, soft-modems, operating systems; and maintaining and securing computer Systems.


